Headteacher's Message

Last week I posed the question about the finishing time on the last day of term before the Christmas and Summer holidays. Eight parents responded and all but one wanted to keep the 2pm finish. This surprised me a little, so I am grateful to the parents who shared their views.

I have also consulted staff who (perhaps not surprisingly!) were also happy to continue with the 2pm finish. The same question was asked of Leamington Hastings parents, who on the whole were keener to change to a later finish time. However, Leamington Hastings' Head, Mrs Marson, and I have agreed that we need a clear consensus to make the change and so we will continue finishing at 2pm on the last day of the Autumn and Summer Terms for Dunchurch Infants and Leamington Hastings and 2.15pm at Dunchurch Juniors. This will allow those parents who collect at one school and then collect older siblings, particular those who have to travel from Leamington Hastings, time to travel. This mirrors the difference in collection times we have every other day in the school year.

YEAR GROUP - CLASS INFORMATION

RAINBOW ROOM

NURSERY

The children have enjoyed learning about people who help us, following on from Remembrance Day. This helped to extend knowledge based vocabulary, whilst discussing how everyone helped. The children have been warming up for Christmas, getting very glittery, creating a friendship & kindness tree with glittery hands, reinforcing how to be kind to one other. Outside, we made huge marks with the chalks and made them disappear with a water spray bottle, practising our mark making & developing our hand/arm strength.

BLUE ROOM & **RED ROOM**

Red Room learnt about space; using blow up planets to aid imaginative play, creating marbling effects & paint mixing, making up stories with a small world planet & searching for space-themed clues during a treasure hunt, writing how many we found. The children in Blue Room learnt about nocturnal animals, using the dark tent to support their role play. The maths area has been busy, with the children practising ordering numbers, selecting the correct amount from a bigger group & recognising numerals significant to them.



LITTLE **OWLS**

RECEPTION

This week in Reception, we have looked at the story of 'Is that what friends do?' and discussed ideas that could make the characters feel happy. The children then wrote short captions about what they could do - they applied their phonics brilliantly and really thought carefully about their 'baby shark' pencil grip. We looked at using the language of 'more' and 'fewer' in Maths and used our odd socks from Anti-Bullying Day to help with this! Once the children identified which sock had 'more' or 'fewer' spots they were able to count how many spots there altogether!

YEAR ONE

In Year 1 this week we have been consolidating our learning of how to write a simple sentence. We have looked at making sure our sentences begin with a capital letter and ends with a full stop, as well as using lollipop sticks and counters to help with our finger spaces. In Maths this week we have been learning about odd and even numbers and how to partition numbers to 20. In Topic we have explored our own toys from home and compared them to toys from the past. We have been looking at the 'oo' family in Phonics and discovered new graphemes which help us make the 'oo' sound.

YEAR TWO

This week, Year 2 have been reading an exciting book about an inventor. They have worked hard unpicking the language and writing the four different sentence types (statement, question, exclamatory and command) about the character. In Maths, the children have been practising adding on a number line and started to subtract 10s and 1s this week too. The children have also started to write their non-chronological reports on their chosen inventor. They have chosen their own sub heading and have been researching lots of facts to write into a paragraph.



If you are available that morning, please let the School Office know at your earliest convenience; much appreciated.


