Headteacher's Message

With the possibility of worse weather in the coming weeks, I thought it would be a good time to remind parents about what happens in the case of extreme weather. Following a closure last year I asked parents to give their views on how we should deal with such situations. In particular, I was interested in whether parents want us to delay making a decision and increase the chances of keeping the school open, or we make an early decision and give more notice. In the past I have preferred the former option, but as the majority of parents wanted the latter, this year I will endeavour to make a decision about closing the school by 7pm the evening before. Hopefully this will make organising childcare easier. Parents will be notified through both www.warwickshire.gov.uk/schoolclosures and our text messaging service.

Parents may not have noticed the plaque on the wall in our hall. It commemorates the building of the school which was ninety years ago this April. To mark this we are planning a number of events. One of which will be an Open Morning on Saturday 4 May where past and current pupils, as well as local residents, will be invited into school. We would like to have the event opened by our youngest pupil and the oldest ex-pupil we can find, so, if you know of any former pupils of a certain vintage, please encourage them to get in touch with school. Regardless of age, we would like as many alumni to attend, so please spread the word to people you know. Further details will be shared nearer the time.

Continuing from last week I would like to summarise some more of the responses from parents when asked about our approach to the curriculum. The third question was about how often children should be learning outside. For Early Years pupils there was a strong consensus towards pupils being outside every day. For pupils in KS1 one answer, which was the favourite among parents, was clear that parents valued being outside and would like this to be an important part of the curriculum. I will feedback more in next week's newsletter.

BLUE ROOM & RED ROOM



RECEPTION

The Reception children read the story of 'The Mitten' by Jan Brett this week; then they had a go at making their own mittens out of paper, with the challenge to fit their hand inside them. This proved quite tricky for some but all of them enjoyed having a go and showed some resilience. They have also worked hard to write about parts of the story by being encouraged to think of their own sentence and remembering it when writing. We were very pleased with the results. In Maths we have been counting and finding one more and one less than, using a group of objects. We then tried to do this straight away without using any objects. It has been a busy week!

YEAR ONE

This week, Year 1 has been using a variety of resources to construct and partition numbers up to 50. They have also been using 100 square grids to help find 1 more/1 less and 10 more/10 less of a number up to 50. In English we have been creating our own fact file on caterpillars and looking at the features found in non-fiction text. For our 1960's topic, we have looked at the 1969 moon landing, as well as learning about Bridget Riley who was a famous optical illusion artist.

This week in English, we have been retelling the story of 'Lost & Found' by creating puppets. Also, the children have been learning about sentences using exclamation marks, conjunctions and expanded noun phrases. In Maths we have continued our work on multiplication by using arrays, repeated addition and have just started word problems. In Topic the children have learnt more about the location of the continents, making comparisons, and learning about the Equator. In SPaG they have learnt about compound words, finding them in texts, as well as writing them in their own sentences. *Please continue to practise 2, 5 & 10 timetables with your child.*
