They have also been comparing amounts in the sand tray, and sometimes even matching numerals to the correct amounts. Outside the children have enjoyed large mark making on the wall with chalks, then using the water spray bottles to erase and start again.	
Blue Room	NURSERY In Blue Room the children have continued learning about dinosaurs, describing their differences & learning their names, even practising writing a few of their names & creating pictures. In Red Room the children have loved exploring the deconstructed role play area, engaging in some dinosaur imaginative play, as well as making up their own CVC words using pegs & cards. We have been impressed as the children have used their phonetic knowledge to write polysyllabic words. Maths - we had a great time during our halving carousel, we used string, strips of paper, play dough, multilink, containers and water and real life pictures to help develop our understanding. Barn Owls	YEAR ONE This week in year 1 we have read the story of Jack and the Beanstalk. We then retold the story in our own words. In maths we have been making equal and unequal groups and have looked at multiplication as repeated addition.
