HEADTEACHER'S MESSAGE

It is now a few weeks since offers for school places were sent to parents. This is a time of some anxiety for many families. While it is pleasing to be a school which is oversubscribed this inevitably leads to disappointment for some families. I am pleased to say that this year all the pupils in our nursery who applied for our reception class have got a place and all of the year two children who applied for a place at Dunchurch Boughton Junior School have also been offered what they wanted. Our reception class remains oversubscribed in a relatively low birth-rate year; we are one of only nine out of thirty schools in the Rugby area which does not have vacancies in September.

A quick reminder: Can parents ensure that if their children have packed lunches they have lunchboxes which are cleaned out each day? Some are not very hygienic.

	NURSERY Rainbow Room This week the children have been reading the story of the 'Colour Monster', discussing their feelings and how others may be feeling. The children have also been exploring different occupations, widening their topic related vocabulary. For next weeks' learning, please could all children bring an empty small water bottle to nursery? They have also been exploring numbers that are significant to them, with lots of discussion around their age & their door number. Little Owls	RECEPTION This week's traditional tale has been 'The Gingerbread Man' and the children have been thinking of their own sentences to write and trying hard to remember their finger spaces. We have learnt all about doubling in maths, the children have used bingo dabbers to help secure their knowledge by doubling the buttons on the gingerbread men, they have loved this! The children have safely used split pins to assemble a moving gingerbread man in our cutting skills area and they have started to explore instruments on our outside stage, singing songs and making up dances to go with their music. Barn Owls	YEAR ONE This week in year 1 we have been learning about multiplication and division by making equal groups and creating arrays. In English we found a special treasure chest in the classroom and found out that it belonged to a giraffe, from the story 'Giraffes Can't Dance.' We have been sequencing the story and acting it out and will be writing about it next week. In topic we have been keeping a Bean Diary and have been observing changes that have happened to our beans. We have been looking at the similarities and differences between the structures of various animals and have grouped them into mammals, reptiles, amphibians, birds, minibeasts and fish.	Snowy Owls
Spectacled Owls	YEAR TWO This week the children have been completing their non-chronological reports about our school and why children should join us. They are superb and very persuasive. In maths we have continued our work on time and trying to solve problems related to time - the time is quarter past 8, what would the time be in 45 minutes - for example. In guided reading we have been practising finding evidence in the text and make inferences'.
