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NURSERY

In Pre-School this week, the children have been learning to compare the size and length of items using mathematical language. They have also been representing length using counters, number blocks, and each other! They have also re-planted the beans that have grown too big for the bags, recalling what they could remember about what plants need to grow. During group learning and continuous provision, the children have been developing their reading comprehension, learning that print has meaning and reads from left to right.

This week in the Rising 3's classroom, the children have been making bunting, using their fine motor strength to use scissors and resources to decorate their pieces. Outside, the children have used natural resources to create a large-scale crown, again using their fine motor skills to stick. The children have been developing their imaginative play by having tea parties, and using play to extend their ideas. All children have loved reading the story of 'The King's Hats' and learning about the Coronation. The children have made crowns, and biscuits, and watched clips of the Royal Family. We look forward to hearing all about their Coronation celebrations next week! Have a fabulous long weekend!



RECEPTION

A short but busy week. We read of the story of 'Lucy's Picture' about a girl who makes a collage picture for her blind Grandpa to feel. The children enjoyed making their own collages on the creative tables using lots of different resources. They have been very creative and imaginative. The children have described objects from a feely bag to their partner. They have tried to make Lucy's picture using small world resources.

We have looked at the work of guide dogs. We have used blind folds to find out what it's like when you can't see. The children took it in turns to be guided by a partner. The children were very caring and careful.

The water area was popular with the children using a magnet to pull objects out of the water.

We enjoyed the Coronation picnic and learning a little about the Coronation ready for this weekend.

In maths we have continued to work with numbers to 20 and beyond. We have moved onto looking at shapes and how shapes can be rotated, this has included looking at tangrams. In phonics we have continued to work on Phase 4 with reading words containing 5 phonemes. New Tricky Words have included – were, here, little and says.

We are missing a few reading books. Please check at home and return any books – we are struggling to make a full set for the next weeks reading practice.

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YEAR 1

As mathematicians, we have been exploring creating and adding equal groups, (we noticed our counting in 2s, 5s and 10s came in very handy)! We then went onto look at what an array is and where we might spot them in the environment.

In English, we have been surprised by gigantic footsteps and magic beans! We have been posing questions and making predictions about these strange events! Where did they come from? Who left them here? We have also been adding to our Bean Diary to keep track of the growth and changes in our plant. As Scientists, we have planned and resourced our own experiment to explore the best growing conditions for cress seeds and made our own predictions about the results.

On Friday we celebrated the upcoming King's Coronation in style by creating our own crowns, enjoying a picnic lunch, creating Royal themed acrostic poems and enjoying activities linked to the story of 'The King's Hat'.

YEAR 2

The end of our first 4-day week! I think we could all get used to this!

As writers, the children have written their own narratives and have edited their work. The year 2 staff have been blown away by the quality of the writing which has been produced. The children have worked exceptionally hard and have really shown progress from the beginning of the year.

As mathematicians, the children have been using mathematical vocabulary such as 'tallest', 'taller', 'shortest', 'shorter', 'longer' and 'longest' when measuring different items in cm.

As scientists, the children have been looking at a range of different materials and have found items from around school that are made from wood, plastic, glass and metal. The children then produced a tally chart to consolidate their previous maths learning to show which items they found the most and least of.

To top off the week today has been wonderful! We have celebrated King Charles' Coronation! The children all made bunting and crowns and have enjoyed taking part in these historical celebrations with a special coronation lunch. All of the children looked fantastic and it's been a pleasure celebrating with them.
