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NURSERY

This week in Pre-School the children have continued their maths learning around 2D & 3D shapes. They have hunted for them around the environment, and at home, and they have created structures and designed castles! The children's knowledge of shapes is really developing and they are using the correct mathematical terms to name them and describe them. Pre-School children have also created 'The King's Pants' after reading the story and discussing the Coronation celebrations. In the construction area and outside, the children have been consolidating their reading comprehension by acting out stories, discussing how stories are structured, and recalling what the different parts of a book are called.

In Rising 3's this week, the children were very excited to have a visit from some chicks! One of our parents was very kind and brought them in for the children to observe and discuss. Also this week, the children have been comparing shapes, noticing when they are similar or different. They have created arrangements with loose parts in the garden, commenting on the patterns they have made. During group time, the children loved playing the musical instruments and were skilled in playing quietly, slowly, loudly, or fast when asked to!











Reception

Another short but busy week.

We have continued to celebrate the King's Coronation. This has included reading the story of 'The King's Hats'. We enjoyed this rhyming book. The children had the opportunity to try on different hats in the role play area which was set up as a Coronation street party. The hats included — woolly, police, builder, party, crown and a top hat. We made and decorated origami hats at the creative table. This was very tricky and the children really persevered, well done. In the construction area the children have enjoyed making Buckingham Palace and Westminster Abbey out of wooden blocks and Lego. We also read the story of 'Mr Gumpy's Outing' and this has helped us to start thinking about *First, Then* and *Next* stories. There was lots of engagement in the investigation area to find out more about magnets. In maths we rotated shapes from a tangram. We also used a number line to count on. In phonics we have read a very long word — 'chimpanzee'! We needed to chunk it into 3 parts to read. We also started





to look at compound words. New Tricky Words included – there, when, what and one.







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YEAR 1

Another week gone in the blink of an eye!

As mathematicians, we have been doubling numbers, spotting number patterns and exploring creating equal groups by grouping and sharing.

In English, we have continued adding to our Bean Diary to keep track of the growth and changes in our plant. We have also been enjoying the traditional tale of Jack and the Beanstalk first through drama and ordering the story with a story map then retelling it by beginning writing our own narrative piece of writing.

As scientists, we have returned to last week's cress experiment, noting the results of each growing condition. Some of the results really surprised us! We have also been identifying and classifying a variety of common animals including fish, amphibians, reptiles, birds and mammals, grouping them and discussing their diets.

In PSHE, we have continued focussing on 'Healthy Me'. Discussing household products (including medicines) how they can help us when we feel poorly and how to use them safely but also harmful if not used properly.

YEAR 2

We have enjoyed another 4-day week but still managed to squeeze in lots of learning and fun! As writers, the children have written a letter to King Charles to congratulate him on his coronation. They're hoping for a reply (as they've asked him lots of questions), but we have told them that even if he doesn't reply (King Charles is very busy) he will still love reading their fabulous writing! As mathematicians, the children have completed their measurement topic and have been revising division and fractions. Their confidence has really grown this week- they're SO ready for SATs! As scientists, the children have completed an experiment to test the absorbency of different paper towels. The children loved doing this and made some brilliant predictions.
