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NURSERY

In Pre-School this week, the children have continued to be interested in and learn about minibeasts. They have been monitoring the caterpillars closely to see how they've grown and if they are ready to cocoon yet. They have used ladybird templates and spots to practice their counting, changing the amounts and describing if they have taken away or added to the amount. During group time, the children in Blue Room took part in Dough Disco, where the children manipulate play dough to music, developing finger and hand strength. To complement this, the children have been challenged to use tweezers to pick out tiny ladybirds from the sand. Outside the children have been making minibeast masks and creating exciting courses with the den-building equipment!

In Rising 3's this week, the children have continued comparing objects, describing their length or size. They have also compared amounts when making saltdough butterflies.

Although not comparing the numerical amounts they discussed whether the recipe called for more or less of an ingredient. The children had lots of fun bug hunting in the garden and found woodlice and a worm! They have also been practicing their scissor skills, snipping

Reception

This week we have read a new book called *All Aboard for the BoBo Road*. It is set in Africa and it has helped us to learn a little bit about Africa. We have tried to retell the story in the small world area. The children have continued to investigate magnets, this week they have used magnets to play games. We have seen lots of concentration and perseverance at the creative table where the children have had a go with weaving.

We have worked hard in maths this week to learn about 'part, part, whole' to work out the answers to mathematical problems. We have also used the language of 'first, then and now' for addition calculations. In phonics we have learnt the last 2 Tricky Words for the year – out and today. We will now spend time recapping on all the Tricky Words. We have also looked at words ending in 'ing', 'ed' and 'est'.

Please can you make sure that all clothing items are named. The weather is becoming warmer and the children want to take off their sweatshirts/cardigans. We want to make sure that the children are reunited with their own clothing at the end of each day.

As mathematicians, we have continued sharing into equal groups pictorially and enjoyed new learning about finding a half of a shape and a half of an amount.

In English, we have continued adding to our Bean Diary to keep track of the growth and changes in our plant. We have moved onto looking at an alternative version of the tale called *Jack and the Jelly Beanstalk*.


