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#### **NURSERY**

All 3 classrooms have let their butterflies go this week! They were in their cocoons over the half-term break and emerged as beautiful butterflies at the beginning of this week, the children were fascinated and loved letting them go.

This week in Pre-School, children have been exploring and talking about the differences between materials that sink or float. They have made predictions of what they think would happen, and then carried out the experiments to find out, noting any changes or surprises! The children have also been developing more complex stories using their imaginative skills. They used small-world characters and whole-group discussions to share their ideas. In Maths, children have been comparing sunflowers, deciding which are taller, smaller etc. And there have been some fabulous sunflowers that have been painted, drawn, created, and made from playdough!



In Rising 3's this week, children have loved engaging in ice cream shop role play! They discussed favourite flavours, used their skills to scoop the ice cream (shaving foam!), and took turns. Some children have been consolidating their knowledge of colour names, by using different coloured collage materials and building with colourful blocks. During group times, children have been developing their conversational skills, jumping from topic to topic whilst remaining focused.

### **RECEPTION**

We are going to be looking at Traditional Tales over the next few weeks. This week we have read the story of the Gingerbread Man which was familiar to most children. They enjoyed joining in with the repeated language as well as retelling the story on the

carpet and in the small world area. The role play area has been turned into an old-fashioned kitchen – no fridge, no microwave, no computer! The children have enjoyed 'making' gingerbread men and cooking them on a stove 'heated' by 'fire'. We have talked about some of the differences. The children have been challenged to make an apron to wear in the kitchen. They have measured ribbon, used wavy scissors and made sure that their apron fits, some children have even added pockets to their aprons! We have

finished our work on floating and sinking.

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The children were challenged to use plasticine to make a boat for the gingerbread man to cross the river so that he wouldn't be eaten by the fox. They persevered to manipulate the plasticine until they had made a boat shape. They tested their boats in water and made any necessary modifications. In maths we have worked on rotating and manipulating shapes to make new shapes eg using 2 small triangles to make a large triangle and making a rectangle from squares. In phonics we have continued with Phase 4 and reading words with long vowel sounds.

There was great excitement when CCTV footage showed what happened when the

Gingerbread Man came into school and shocked the staff!





#### YEAR 1

It is lovely to have you back and well-rested Year One!

As mathematicians, we have been focussing on position and direction. We have been playing games to get to grips with our lefts and rights as well as quarter, half, three quarter and full turns.

As Historians, we have been using non-fiction texts to research the events of The Great Fire of London. We used a painting of the fire to create a senses poem using adjectives to make our writing more interesting to read.

Summer is finally upon us! We have been discussing the season of Summer and making comparisons to the other seasons in a year.

During ICT we have been coding programmes and even 'de-bugging' codes to ensure a programme runs correctly.

Please could we ask families to save and bring into school cardboard boxes (roughly cereal box size) for an upcoming Design and Technology project, thank you!

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### YEAR 2

A very sunny welcome back to school! We cannot believe that we are already on the final half term of the year. This half term is jam-packed full of exciting activities for the children including; sports day, school leavers play, maypole dancing performance, transition days and a school trip to Twycross Zoo and the Alive festival! We are exhausted just thinking about it all but what a special way to make memories before the children leave us here at the Infant school. So much to look forward to!

This week, as mathematicians, the children have been comparing the weight of different objects and have used key mathematical vocabulary such as 'mass', 'heaviest' and 'lightest' when making their comparisons. As writers, we have started to read the story; 'Meerkat Mail' and have been looking at the different features of a postcard. Next week we will be writing our own.

Our new topic this half term is 'Wild Africa' and so the children have been using atlases to locate African countries on the map. Some children have family or have visited Africa themselves so it has been fascinating hearing all about Africa from them.

### **Thurlaston Fête 2023**
