
## Dunchurch Infant School and Nursery

#### **RECEPTION PARENTS**

Last term, you were given a letter from Compass, the School Health and Wellbeing Service, with regards to your child taking part in a Height and Weight Check. It explained that every year in England, children in Reception and Year 6 have their height and weight measured as part of the National Child Measurement Programme (NCMP) and if you did not wish your child to take part, there was an opting out process.

This is a reminder for you that the check will be taking place on the afternoon of Tuesday 23 January.

## APPLICATIONS FOR RECEPTION AND JUNIOR SCHOOL PLACES FOR SEPTEMBER 2018

Following recent applications, in the event that the Infant School is over-subscribed, then the following criteria will be used when allocating places:

- 1. Children in the care of, or provided with accommodation by, the local authority and children who were looked after but ceased to be so because they were adopted.
- 2. Children living in the priority area who will have a sibling at the Infant or Junior School at the time of admission.
- 3. Children living in the priority area who have attended Dunchurch Nursery for a minimum of two terms.
- 4. Other children living in the priority area.
- 5. Children living outside the priority area who have a sibling at the Infant School at the time of admission.
- 6. Children living outside the priority area who have attended Dunchurch Nursery for a minimum of two terms.
- 7. Children living outside the priority area who have a sibling at the Junior School.
- 8. Other children living outside the priority area.
