# **YEAR GROUP - CLASS INFORMATION**

RAINBOW ROOM	<b>NURSERY</b> This week we have been busy noticing different shapes in the environment and in pictures. We have used the construction resources to create shapes & structures. We have also loved having pasta in the role play area to recreate our focus story; 'Goldilocks & the Three Bears'. We have been practising our mark-making skills through creating pictures of daffodils with various mark-making resources.	
BLUE ROOM & RED ROOM	We have been using various maths resources to correctly match amounts to numerals, as well as comparing amounts. Following discussions about taking care of pets when Zoolab visited, we have been making bird feeders to hang up in the garden. We have also started to learn about initial sounds of words.	
LITTLE OWLS	<b>RECEPTION</b> This week, we have been enjoying our last week of the pizzeria and even got to make and eat some real pizzas; they were delicious! Phonics – We learnt about tri-graphs 'air' & 'ear' and recapped 'air', 'ure', 'er'. Maths - We have been using objects to take away and beginning to count back using the rhyme '10 in the Bed' to help us.	ELF OWLS

BARN OWLS	In English we have been writing about our trip to the castle using time adverbials (words like first, next, then, after and finally). In maths we have been learning about halves and quarters of shapes and objects. In art we have been creating paintings of our own dragons. We have been learning about plurals and when to add an 'es' or an 's' to the end of words. We have been reading words containing 'ch' and 'tch'. We all had a great time at Kenilworth Castle and enjoyed spotting features of the castles like arrow slits, battlements and garderobes!	SNOWY OWLS
SPECTACLED OWLS	<b>YEAR TWO</b> This week, we have been reading the story 'The Lighthouse Keeper's Lunch'. We have based our English lessons around this and the children have all done really well. They were able to summarise the story as a part of their guided reading, as well as writing a character profile about Mr Grinling. Their focus has been to use conjunctions, allowing them to extend their sentences with additional information. In maths, we have been learning about fractions. The children have found fractions of numbers - 1/2, 1/4 and 1/3 - which was based on their learning of fractions of shapes. Also in maths, we have been studying statistics. The children have learnt how to do tallies, pictograms and bar charts. In SPaG, we have looked at the spelling rules for the suffix 'ment'.	TAWNY OWLS
