YEAR GROUP - CLASS INFORMATION

NURSERY This week, we had lots of fun using paints to create butterflies and talking about pattern and colour. We had real fruit in our water tray **RAINBOW** with containers of different sizes and tweezers to make fruit potions. **ROOM** To aid our counting, we have also been creating flowers with Numicon symbols on, which also helped us to discuss amounts. In Blue Room, we have created a huge castle in our imaginative play area, following on from our learning about princesses, princes, knights **BLUE ROOM** and weddings. We have also been getting super messy exploring what happens when we mix colours using paint and shaving foam. In Red Room, we have been using real fruit and vegetables to take part **RED ROOM** in some still life painting, using colours for a particular purpose. We have also been using brightly coloured shallow sand to practice our letter formation. Please can children from Red Room bring in their favourite story book after the half term break for 'Show & Tell'. Thank you. RECEPTION We have finished off Traditional Tales by writing about 'Goldilocks LITTLE OWLS **ELF OWLS** and the Three Bears'. Some have chosen to write the whole story! They included lots of story language and made excellent attempts to write polysyllabic words. The children tried salty and sweet popcorn to think about different flavours. In maths they have compared different heights of children and used mathematical language such as taller and shorter. We also compared the heights of the three bears. We have been talking about time and used language such as today, tomorrow and yesterday; we have also looked at clocks. A challenge has been set to make a nest that can hold a wooden egg. The children have experimented with different materials to produce a functional nest. Phonics - recap reading and writing of Phase 3 & reading and writing polysyllabic words. YEAR ONE This week, we have been practicing counting in ones to, and **BARN OWLS SNOWY OWLS** across, 100. We have also been counting in 2s, 5s and 10s and partitioning and creating numbers using tens and ones. We have looked at the syllables in words and have discussed features of poems and creating our own syllable poems about animals. **YEAR TWO** Mrs Rawes, Mrs Horne and Miss Lodge would like to say 'Well **SPECTACLED** TAWNY OWLS Done' to all of the Year 2 pupils as they have worked extremely **OWLS** hard this half term and deserve a relaxing half term. In English the children have created and designed a character and setting for their own story, which they will be writing after half term. In maths we have learnt about multiplication being commutative but division not, and proving it. Over the holidays please can your child learn the poem on their homework sheet, as well as re-capping telling the time for after

half term.
