Infant Agility focuses on key sporting skills such as throwing, running and jumping and developing them with fun activities. It is aimed at young children with intention that the skills they learn can then be used in a variety of sports as they get older. Children from Year 2 competed against Crackley Hall from Kenilworth. All the children did really well and competed enthusiastically. They represented the school well, not just in their activities, but in their conduct and behaviour too. RAINBOW ROOM

NURSERY

This week, we have been busy making stretchy dough, to compliment our lovely pizza shop role play area, complete with pizza oven! We have been learning about circles and shapes, what makes them different and creating them with natural resources. We have also been playing parachute games; this helps us to take turns, follow instructions, practise our listening skills and aid our colour recognition.

BLUE ROOM & RED ROOM

In Blue Room, we have had discussions around being kind and respectful, learning what this means within the classroom and making 'Kindness Hands'. We have been comparing groups of objects, identifying how many and recognising whether they are the same or not.

In Red Room, we have been sequencing the frog/butterfly life cycles, as well as other events, through cutting out and sticking events in order. We have also been practising our number and shape formation by using the paintbrushes and water on the wall outside.

RECEPTION

The adults and children have really enjoyed hearing about each other's holiday. This has been a great opportunity for the children to demonstrate their improved speaking and listening skills; thank you for helping with this. We have been writing about 'Supatato' and this has led us to learning about being healthy. The children have been choosing to buy healthy foods in the supermarket role play. In maths we have been weighing. The children have used scales to find which classroom items are the heaviest/lightest. We have used lots of weighing language to compare the items. In phonics the children have worked on CVCC words, as well as reading and writing words from Phase 3 and 4.

YEAR ONE




