Last week we had the firefighters from Rugby Station come to visit us to talk about fire safety. This week in English we have been writing our own personal recount about what we learnt when the firefighters came. 




We won 1st prize in our group at the Dunchurch Fete as Dunchurch **Infant & Nursery's Little Kingdom**
