## HEADTEACHER'S MESSAGE

From time-to-time, myself and colleagues carry out monitoring activities where we check that pupils are receiving the high standards of education that we all expect. This week we have spent some time looking at reading in the school. Normally this is not something I write about in the newsletter; we would usually identify what we do well as well as areas in which we can improve and this would be discussed with colleagues. In this case though an aspect of reading relates directly to parents. We have noticed that many parents are not reading with their children as much as they once may have. This is not something we have noticed just this week, but over a longer period of time, however the issue was brought into focus this week when we compared children's reading ability with how often parents read with them. There is a clear correlation (and presumably causation) between reading with your child and their attainment.

It is not just listening to a child read that is important, I would encourage you to read to your child too. Even as they get older it is of great importance to continue with this. Through this activity parents expose their child to more complex language which they would not be able to read themselves. As well as broadening their horizons reading to your child also helps to show that books are important and are to be enjoyed.

	<p style="text-align: center;"><b>NURSERY</b> <b>Rainbow Room</b></p> <p>This week the children have loved accessing the shop role play area, shopping for real items, using real money, making shopping lists and engaging in collaborative play. The children have also created their lists for Santa and been to the post office to post them; fingers crossed for a reply. Outside, the children have been making their own musical instruments, using bottles and noisy items. For next week, please bring in kitchen/toilet roll inners so that we can use them for our learning.</p>	
<p style="text-align: center;"><b>Blue Room</b></p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><b>NURSERY</b></p> <p>The children have been continuing with their space theme, but now making aliens and designing pants, whilst they have read 'Aliens Love Underpants'. They have also created number rockets, choosing an amount of shapes to use, and then numbering them for blast off. Outside, the children have used props and masks on the stage area to sing and act out '5 Little Men in a Flying Saucer'.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><b>Red Room</b></p>

The children made predictions first before testing the items. We were impressed by some of the reasons for why they might float/sink. We finished the 'One-Armed Robot' letters in handwriting carousel this week. We will be moving on to practise the last letter family next week - the 'Zig-Zag Monster' letters.</p> <p>We looked at the story of the 'Stick Man' in Literacy and the children concentrated hard when writing words/captions. We started looking at patterns in maths, the children were good at recognising what the repeating pattern was and carrying it on. We created repeating patterns with colour, shape, size and people. Look out for your child's Nativity words in their book bags and please practise them over the weekend 😊 Thank you.</p>	 <p style="text-align: center;"><b>Elf Owls</b></p>

They have been learning their words and the songs and we are all really proud of their efforts. In maths we have been learning about 2d shapes and have been creating patterns with them. We have been naming them and describing their properties (taking care not to mix them up with 3d shapes!) In English we have used our pointillism paintings to write a new adventure for our books, based on the story 'Katie and the Bathers'. In art we have learned about Kandinsky and have been using his painting 'squares with concentric circles' to create our own works of art. We have continued our work on health and self-care and have been practising the correct techniques for hand washing and brushing teeth.</p>	 <p style="text-align: center;"><b>Snowy Owls</b></p>

They have worked systematically to find all the solutions. In English the children have been writing a character profile about Jane Pinny and learning about past and present tense, expanded noun phrases and conjunctions. The children have used some great evidence from the text. In topic the children have been studying Picasso and self-portraits. They have taken selfies, learnt the positioning of features of their face and how to draw them. 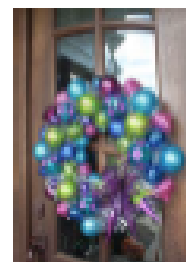
