HEADTEACHER'S MESSAGE

From time-to-time, myself and colleagues carry out monitoring activities where we check that pupils are receiving the high standards of education that we all expect. This week we have spent some time looking at reading in the school. Normally this is not something I write about in the newsletter; we would usually identify what we do well as well as areas in which we can improve and this would be discussed with colleagues. In this case though an aspect of reading relates directly to parents. We have noticed that many parents are not reading with their children as much as they once may have. This is not something we have noticed just this week, but over a longer period of time, however the issue was brought into focus this week when we compared children's reading ability with how often parents read with them. There is a clear correlation (and presumably causation) between reading with your child and their attainment.

It is not just listening to a child read that is important, I would encourage you to read to your child too. Even as they get older it is of great importance to continue with this. Through this activity parents expose their child to more complex language which they would not be able to read themselves. As well as broadening their horizons reading to your child also helps to show that books are important and are to be enjoyed.

We were impressed by some of the reasons for why they might float/sink. We finished the 'One-Armed Robot' letters in handwriting carousel this week. We will be moving on to practise the last letter family next week - the 'Zig-Zag Monster' letters. We looked at the story of the 'Stick Man' in Literacy and the children concentrated hard when writing words/captions. We started looking at patterns in maths, the children were good at recognising what the repeating pattern was and carrying it on. We created repeating patterns with colour, shape, size and people. Barn Owls	This week the children have been busy rehearsing their Christmas play. They have been learning their words and the songs and we are all really proud of their efforts. In maths we have been learning about 2d shapes and have been creating patterns with them. We have been naming them and describing their properties (taking care not to mix them up with 3d shapes!) In English we have used our pointillism paintings to write a new adventure for our books, based on the story 'Katie and the Bathers'. In art we have learned about Kandinsky and have been using his painting 'squares with concentric circles' to create our own works of art.
