Newsletter 22nd May 2020

On Wednesday I wrote to families to explain our approach to assessing the risks in having more children in school from June 1st. As well as details of the risks, I wrote about the actions we were taking to make things safer. By the time you read this we will have finished taking 'bookings' for places. Further information will be sent out next week to families who have asked for a place. A reminder that schools opening is dependent on the government's targets being met. Assuming we are allowed to and our risk assessments (which we are reviewing regularly) don't change for the worse, both schools will be open for eligible pupils from June 1st.

I have had a lot of positive feedback following Wednesday's letter, thank you to all those who have got in touch. The media speculation in the last few weeks has been relentless and it has been frustrating seeing so many people at national level play politics with the issue. Since I wrote to parents on Wednesday I have corresponded with dozens of families and it has been a pleasure to have such constructive conversations with people who share our only interest - the welfare of children. I respect the decisions made by those who would rather keep their children at home for the time being and I am glad that we are able to offer full time places to those who do want their children to return. These children will be able to see more of their friends, learn more and for some parents it will allow them to get back to work. In time, I hope we will be able to offer more children this opportunity, but for the foreseeable future this will just be an offer; there will be no compulsion, I understand what a difficult choice this is for families.

There will be a number of adjustments made to the school over half-term. For example we are moving some furniture into spare classrooms to create more space in those rooms which will have children. Another job is putting pencils, glue sticks, scissors and the like into individual wallets so children will have their own set of equipment which other children won't touch. If any parents are available on Tuesday, Wednesday or Thursday mornings next week and wouldn't mind helping me for an hour or two to get things ready, please get in touch via my email address below. We will of course ensure social distancing at all times.

We have been asked to share two letters from the Warwickshire Local Authority, one from Ian Budd, the Assistant Director of Education and Shade Agboola, the Director of Public Health. Both give further context to the local situation regarding schools allowing more pupils in from June 1st and they are attached to the email this newsletter was sent with.



draw a sign to put by my bed that says 'Keep Off'! 😸 Have a lovely, relaxing half term everyone Love from Woody 🌈 🏷



Warwickshire County Music Updates.

Pupils that are in their first, second or third year of learning an instrument:

Parents of pupils who have been learning any instrument for 1-3 years with Warwickshire Music have been invited to join our 'Charanga' portal where a series of generic instrument specific resources have been put together by our specialist team. These can be accessed to continue instrumental learning.

Parents sign up via the Warwickshire Music Website and we have had huge uptake so far. Parents require an individual log in so we have opened this offer specifically to instrument hire customers in the first instance to manage capacity.

During Covid- 19 lock down Warwickshire Music are providing these instrument specific resources for free. Charanga is a Warwickshire Music partner and the Charanga platform is widely used across Warwickshire primary schools for primary music curriculum delivery.
