Yesterday you will have received an email from either of the two school offices (unless you only have a child in the nursery, in which case you will be sent one today). This is an important email, so it is worth me emphasising the content. In it there is a link for a survey where we hope to find out about parents' interest in two things:

#### Returning to school after June 29th

As written in the email, we would very much like all children to return to school as soon as possible. The restrictions under which we currently operate, namely having only 15 children to a 'bubble', make it impossible for all children to be in at once, but we may be able to offer some time in school for those who want it. While the amount of learning missed over the last three months cannot be made up in a couple of days, we think it would help children to experience the routine of school for some time before the summer and see some of their friends again. As has been the case throughout the pandemic, there is no compulsion, this is only for parents who feel they are ready for their children to be back in school. Regardless, it would be helpful for all parents to fill in the survey.

#### Holiday Club

We know that some parents have a need for childcare over the course of the Summer holidays and that many are anxious about their children missing out on key learning over the last few months. There has been some speculation nationally about what provision, if any, should exist for children over the summer, but there has been no plans announced by the government at the time of writing. In the absence of this, we are starting to think about what we can do and a holiday club could give children access to teaching, as well as fun activities and in doing so address the two needs many parents have.

For both of these areas, we will let you know next week what our plans are. Having more children from June 29th is challenging, so once we have numbers by Friday, we will make plans over the weekend and share with governors, who for our two schools are the body who must give approval for a change in our plans. By Tuesday the governors will have made a decision and we will send communications out to parents on Wednesday. It may be that we are not able to accommodate all children who want a place, but I want parents to know that we will try our best.

Tomorrow is a teacher training day. As discussed in last week's newsletter, we have a number of activities going on for our staff. Although at times the issue of Coronavirus has been all consuming, we are trying hard to keep an eye on the future and tomorrow's training will help us be ready for the next school year. On the subject of next year, I will share with you next week details about which staff will be with which classes next year, as well as activities we are planning to help children with the transition to their new year groups.


#### **Contacting Teachers**
