Dear parents/carers and children,

I hope you are all well and have enjoyed the mixed weather this week. It was lovely to see so many photographs uploaded to Seesaw of families having fun in the snow at the beginning of the week.

A group of C.C.F.C. fans led by Mr. Newton in the village, have provided a tablet for the Junior school and Hayley Burke an ex-employee of the Infant school has kindly donated a laptop. Mr. and Mrs. Crighton have also kindly donated a laptop and tablet. Thank you for these kind donations. Last week I told you that the DfE had provided 10 laptops for the Junior school. This week Warwickshire County Council will be providing 9 laptops for the Infant school. These will be distributed to families to support with remote learning.

During the last week of this half term, both schools will have a focus on mental health and well-being. Teachers will continue to set maths and English work on Seesaw, but will then focus on supporting this using many different resources. We will also be trying to encourage the links between children in school and children at home. Also during this week we will be teaching about Internet Safety and how children can keep safe. Warwickshire School Health have recommended a Time to Talk activity sheet, created by their school nurse team, compiling family-orientated resources in the form of games and activities designed to instigate conversation. Woody's Blog

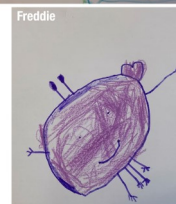
Hi Everyone

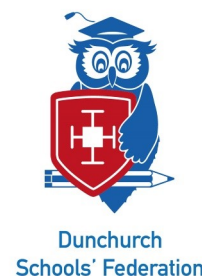

At the start of the week many of our children enjoyed some seasonal snow fun. The children in the Junior school certainly wasted no time in creating their own special snow sculptures!



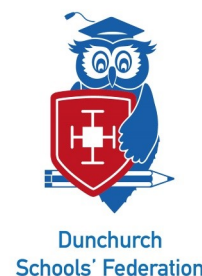
