


Assemblies and Collective Worship

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Nursery

The children in Nursery have loved the sun shining a little more this week! Long may it last. In Blue Room, the children have been having fun representing numbers all around the classroom, using marks on paper, their fingers, and bricks in the construction area. They have also had lovely discussions about their differences and what makes them unique, they had lots of fantastic suggestions! In Red Room, the children have learning about animals, looking at their similarities and differences, then going off into our continuous provision to try and create some animals. The children did this using creative materials, but also construction and imaginative skills. Also, in the creative area, they have been painting pictures of themselves, using the colours for appropriate features, and mixing the colours to make alternative ones if needed.



And in Rainbow Room, the children have baked some lovely biscuits today! They have also been developing their awareness of numbers and counting, through small group learning rolling a dice and counting actions, which they loved!



Reception

We have read the story of 'Lucy's Picture' about a girl who makes a collage picture for her blind Grandpa to feel. The children have enjoyed making their own collages using lots of different materials. We have listened to each other talk about their creations and explain what they have used.

The new beebots have been popular and the children have worked hard to program them to move forward – lots of excitement!

We are really getting into the swing of our Reading Practise sessions. In phonics we have learnt some difficult trigraphs – 'ear' and 'air'. It has been very pleasing to see the children working hard to read and spell the new words.







Year 1

We are **SO** impressed with how independent the children are becoming in Computing lessons, they listen carefully during inputs and are able to log on by entering the Year 1 username and password, open up the Purple Mash Dunchurch homepage and then log-in to their personal Purple Mash page before finding the appropriate program!! This is allowing the children to have maximum time exploring the program and putting their skills to practise! They are thoroughly enjoying the lessons on a Monday afternoon.

We are now on our second cycle of visiting the school Library in order for the children to choose a book that they would like to take home to read/share - they are quickly understanding the expectations when being in the Library and it is fantastic to see the children become excited and talk about various books with their peers.

We are sure you have all heard about the egg! It was incredibly exciting when we found out that it had hatched this week and left us a note! The children are focusing on writing instructions on how we can take care of the egg. Who knows what it will hatch into!







Year 2

This week we have been writing a retell of 'The Lighthouse Keeper's Lunch' and we have been so impressed with the progress that the children have made in their writing. We have been learning about fractions this week. We have been finding halves, quarters and thirds of shapes and amounts and some of the questions have been quite challenging.

In topic we have been creating some exciting mother's day surprises so watch out for these coming home at the end of next

week...!
