SCHOOL BOOK BAGS - Library and Reading books

Please note below the days we expect the book bags in school for each year group:-

Reception - bring in on a Monday and returned home on Wednesday with new Library and Reading book.

Year 1 - bring in everyday with reading books. Library book changed on a Tuesday and Reading book on a Wednesday.

Year 2 - bring in from a Wednesday and returned home on Friday. Library and Reading books changed on a Friday.

'This is an update from the information sent by Mr Andrews yesterday'

The local authority has updated its guidance sent yesterday to include the new national guidance of the reduction of isolation for people under 18 years of age.

Update as follows:

"For children testing positive for COVID-19 (under 18 years old), they should stay at home for 3 days and avoid contact with others. They should then return to school and normal activities only if well enough and don't have a temperature."

We are seeking clarification around whether a child who is still testing positive at day 3, or an adult at day 5, without a temperature, is able to return to school. The guidance seems to suggest this given that LFTs and PCRs are no longer an expected part of 'living with COVID' and used as an individual's or family's 'preference'. Once we have had further clarification, we will update everyone accordingly.

Mrs. Miller has now trained some year 2 children who want to be Librarians.

They are now on a rota to look after our Library and keep it tidy. We will change this rota after the holiday, so more children get an opportunity.

Thank you to all the Year 2 children who have volunteered for this role.
