They have also practised their counting from 1 to 5 through singing their song of the week, '5 Little Speckled Frogs', as well as getting messy in the water tray with the frogs! It was lovely to see so many of you at our Open Morning on Tuesday, the children loved showing you around their classrooms and I hope you enjoyed learning more about our Continuous Provision.









RECEPTION

The story for this week is 'Giraffes Can't Dance'. The story talks about keeping on trying and not giving up, we have encouraged everyone to do this. We have been very pleased with the children's writing about the story, their hard work is starting to pay off. The children have retold the story in the small world, as well as make up their own stories about jungle animals. They have been busy making giraffes in both the cutting and creative areas.

The new Beebot track has been very popular, so has the Ipad table – lots of



technology this week! The weather has been warm and the children have enjoyed being outside. Please remember to send the children in with a named sun hat.

In maths we are continuing counting to 20 and beyond whilst also looking at 2 D shapes in different rotations. In phonics we have continued reading and writing words using the chunking method. We have also worked hard to read words ending in 's' and 'es'.

It was wonderful to see so many of you at our Early Years Open Morning. We hope it has given you an understanding of Continuous Provision and how the children are learning.


In Maths the children have been working hard to understand positional language, some of this has been rather tricky! Especially when we looked at quarter turns and three-quarter turns. Lots of practical movements were occurring in the Year 1 classrooms!

We started looking at animals in Topic this week and labelling the different parts of various animals. We then moved on to sorting various animals into Reptiles, Birds, Mammals, Fish and Amphibians before making comparisons.

Next Wednesday morning we will be tidying up the Year 1 garden and sowing the seeds that Mrs Lewis helped us to plant during last half term. We are hoping to add a special 'jubilee edition' to our Year 1 garden too - hopefully we will be able to share this next week!

YEAR 2

This week in year 2 the children have worked really hard to complete special learning in maths. We have also continued looking at measurements and have been measuring temperature. In English we have studied Revolting Rhymes poems by Roald Dhal and have created our own beasts. We then wrote rhyming poems about them. This week in topic we have been learning about things that are living and non-living as part of our science work. We have learned about animals and their habitats and have had fun creating our own micro-habitats.
