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NURSERY

The children in Pre-School have been continuing to consolidate their learning around numerals, amounts, and representations of 1-5. They have done this by matching animals, creating amounts with natural resources outside, comparing amounts, and singing songs where numbers are added or taken away up to 5. They have also started to learn about the natural environment in Spring, and talked about animals and growing. Children have created animals with the playdough and described it to a friend. In the creative area, the children have been painting or drawing beautiful pictures of daffodils.

In Rising 3's, children have been using equipment with playdough that requires lots of strength and squeezing. This helps them to gain control over their one-handed tools and build up muscles to control their later writing. Children have also created pictures from shapes, arranging them for a purpose and giving their picture meaning.

Today it was Red Nose Day and all the children dressed up or wore red! There was lots of discussion around the Mr & Miss characters! Children in Rising 3's decorated biscuits with different faces on.



RECEPTION

Everyone has loved reading Funnybones this week. We have talked about the different bones that make up our skeletons as well as learning which foods help us to have healthy bones and teeth – we have learnt a new word – 'calcium'. We have talked about other healthy foods and had a go at making a 'food rainbow'. We discussed foods that may not be healthy. It was decided that is ok to have these foods as a treat but not every day.

The children enjoyed making skeletons at the creative table. They used paper straws and cut them to size to make different bones. We found that we needed to use black paper so that the white straws showed up. The straws stuck to the paper better if we flattened them first as well as using PVA glue rather than a glue stick because it is stronger.

We have continued to recap Phase 3 in phonics. We have been reading words that contain 2 or more digraphs. In maths we have started to learn the number bonds to 10. These need to be learnt as quick recall rather than using fingers. We have also played a free online game called 'Hit the Button' <https://www.topmarks.co.uk/maths-games/hit-the-button>. Select 'Play Game' - 'Number Bonds' – 'Make 10'.



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YEAR 1

As magnificent mathematicians this week we have continued exploring comparing numbers to 50 and ordering them from fewest to greatest and greatest to fewest. Then moved on to exploring length and height using the appropriate vocabulary (longer, longest, shorter, shortest, taller, tallest) and putting lengths in order.

In English, we have been preparing ourselves for our upcoming excursion to Warwick Castle. We have been exploring non-fiction texts to answer and pose questions about castles and castle life, labelled the main parts of a castle and discovered their function.

During our themed learning, we have learnt about Saint Patrick the Patron Saint of Northern Ireland and the traditions people may take part in to celebrate St Patrick's Day. As Scientists, we have been identifying the parts of the body associated with our five senses and during ICT we have been using an online piece of software to label a castle. In PE lessons, we have seen some fierce dragon dancing!

A packed week as always in Year One. Have a fantastic weekend all!



YEAR 2

What a lovely week we have had in year 2!

As writers, the children have blown us away with their fantastic non-chronological reports all about foxes. They have presented these beautifully and it has been a pleasure to see how proud they all are of their hard work.

As mathematicians, the children have started learning about money and are beginning to add coins together to make amounts. They will progress on to answering two-step word problems within the next couple of weeks, which through experience we know that they will find tricky. However, we have no doubt that they will all be able to rise to the challenge! Any practise using money at home would be greatly appreciated and valuable for the children. They will be expected to add amounts together and then work out the total change.

During the afternoons, the children have been learning how to sew and have made something special for mummies to open on Sunday! This was the first time for the majority of the children that they have ever sewed so we are extremely proud of their perseverance and the finished result! We hope that all you mummies are too!

Finally, as you are all aware, last Friday we were due to visit the Gurdwara but this had to be cancelled due to the snow. We have contacted the Gurdwara and are trying to arrange an alternative date that we can attend. We will keep you updated with plans as they are made.

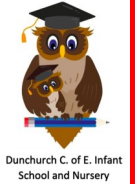
